### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS | EL RIO OPEN SPACE PRESERVE

### How was the preserve funded?

- Some funding was provided by the Town of Marana.
- A Water Infrastructure Financing Authority Grant for \$35,000 was awarded to the Town for the project.

### What types of activities are permitted at this facility?

 Passive recreation such as walking and wildlife viewing! It is a regional wildlife corridor and a natural riparian area.

## What activities are not allowed at the preserve?

Off-road vehicle driving, shooting, fishing, boating and off-leash dogs.

#### Can we swim, boat, or fish in the lake/wet areas?

- The water includes storm water runoff and occasionally overflow effluent from the Santa Cruz River, so it is not suitable for swimming, boating or fishing.
- The area was created for waterfowl and other wildlife.
- This preserve is intended as an urban natural area and wildlife corridor, so there will not be any sports or activities that would detract from that goal.

## Are there lights at this facility?

• There is no lighting at this site so that it will function as wildlife habitat. So many animals are active here at night.

### Why can't this site be left as is, natural open space?

The site will continue to be natural open space. Improvements will
continually be made by replacing some of the non-native species with
native plants and by creating surface water areas that are permanent, to
enhance wildlife habitat.

## Won't having permanent surface water increase the mosquito problem?

- Permanent water will be circulated to prevent mosquito eggs from hatching.
- The bank protection installed helps to reduce flooding and debris piles where mosquitos can breed.
- Fresh, non-potable water will be added as needed, which also helps prevent stagnation and mosquitos.

- Monitoring and treatment will be implemented by the Town during the warm weather months.
- Unfortunately, these improvements will not eliminate mosquitos from breeding in the Santa Cruz River.

# What will the operating hours be at the new park?

• The preserve is open to visitors between dawn and dusk.
